KEYNOTES

Making Campuses Safer - TOGETHER: Addressing the Complexity of School and University Threats Now and in the Future AUGUST 7 | 8:45 AM - 9:30 AM



James A. Gagliano's Keynote address will highlight the necessary 21st century changes in safety and security postures in academic environments.

He will discuss recent responses in the active shooter realm, from a historical perspective, and address contemporary challenges to an ever-evolving threat matrix.



James "Jimmy" A. Gagliano Ret. Supervisory Special Agent (SSA) FBI Gagliano is a retired Supervisory Special Agent

for the FBI with a quarter-century experience in mitigating criminal and terrorist threats. He has vast experience in the crisis resolution arena which he now shares as a homeland security

professor, television law enforcement analyst, and sought-after security industry speaker.

He was awarded the Medal for Bravery, the FBI's second highest award for valor, for actions in June of 1993 while serving on the SWAT Team. In 2010, awarded "Top Gang Unit" by the New York Gang Investigator's Association and "True American Hero" award from the Federal Drug Agents Foundation. In 2012, he was selected as the senior F.B.I. law enforcement official and the Director's personal representative to the Mexican government, while overseeing federal law enforcement operations that included kidnappings, white collar crime, foreign espionage, crimes against children, cyber matters, narco-trafficking, and fugitive apprehension. He was appointed Chief of Staff, Special Assistant to the Assistant-Director-in-Charge in January of 2015 for the FBI's largest field office in New York.

Saving Sycamore: The School Shooting that Never Happened AUGUST 8 | 8:00 AM - 9:00 AM

Molly Hudgens shares the story of how she prevented a school shooting on September 28, 2016. When a student with a fullyloaded semi-automatic handgun came to her with a plan to kill people on the school's campus, he told her, "I came to you because you're the only person who can talk me out of this." After a ninety-minute intervention, the student relinquished the weapon to Hudgens with no shots fired and no lives lost. She will walk the audience through the specifics of the incident that took place in her office and highlights previous training that affected her decision-making process during the event.

Molly Bradley Hudgens is in her twentieth year as an educator in the Cheatham County School System as a school counselor at

Sycamore Middle School in Pleasant View, TN. She has used her in-depth study, "Recognizing Red Flags," to train professionals in education, law enforcement, juvenile probation and court. On September 28, 2016, she talked a student with a loaded handgun from committing a mass shooting at Sycamore Middle School. Hudgens is the 2004-2005 and 2016-2017 Sycamore Middle School and Cheatham County Middle School Teacher of the Year and Congressional Medal of Honor Citizens Honor recipient for a Single Act of Heroism from the Congressional Medal of Honor Foundation in March of 2017. She is the 2017 recipient of the TN School Counseling Association's Phoebe White Award for Excellence in School Counseling.


