Recovery and Resilience: Taking Care of Yourself, Your Staff, and Your Community

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Proper planning and preparedness should be a priority when it comes TRANSACT to school safety, but as we work together towards safer campuses, we must remember to think about

the long-term effects disasters have on a community. In order to effectively help others in the aftermath of a tragedy, we must first take care of ourselves. Chief Freeman will provide a timely and energetic keynote on the importance of taking care of yourself, so you can successfully help others who have also been affected.



Chief Michele Freeman, CJM City of Las Vegas Dept. Public Safety

Michele Freeman began her law enforcement career in 1992 with the City of Las Vegas Department of Public Safety as a Corrections Officer. She served as Corporal, Sergeant, Lieutenant, and as a privileged member of

the department's Special Emergency Response Team (SERT) in 2006. She was appointed Chief of the department in June 2011. Chief Freeman leads 452 civilian and Category I and III sworn employees and provides fiscal management of the department's \$84 million dollar budget where they have been advancing through progressive 21st-century strategies. She has been a continuous champion of mental health support, suicide awareness and prevention and has maintained an ongoing commitment to her employees and their well-being. Under her leadership, the department added its first, dedicated, Crisis Intervention Administrator; a trained mental health professional who provides support to the department through education and counsel to those encountering crises.

Saving Sycamore: The School **Shooting that Never Happened**

JUNE 19 | 8:00 AM - 9:00 AM

Molly Hudgens shares the story of how she prevented a school shooting on September 28, 2016. When a student with a fullyloaded semi-automatic handgun came to her with a plan to kill people on the school's campus, he told her, "I came to you because you're the only person who can talk me out of this." After a ninety-minute intervention, the student relinquished the weapon to Hudgens with no shots fired and no lives lost. She will walk the audience through the specifics of the incident that took place in her office and highlights previous training that affected her decision-making process during the event.



Molly Bradley Hudgens Counselor, Sycamore Middle School Owner, Molly B. Hudgens **Communications**

Molly Bradley Hudgens is in her twentieth year as an educator in the Cheatham County School System as a school counselor at

Sycamore Middle School in Pleasant View, TN. She has used her in-depth study, "Recognizing Red Flags," to train professionals in education, law enforcement, juvenile probation and court. On September 28, 2016, she talked a student with a loaded handgun from committing a mass shooting at Sycamore Middle School. Hudgens is the 2004-2005 and 2016-2017 Sycamore Middle School and Cheatham County Middle School Teacher of the Year and Congressional Medal of Honor Citizens Honor recipient for a Single Act of Heroism from the Congressional Medal of Honor Foundation in March of 2017. She is the 2017 recipient of the TN School Counseling Association's Phoebe White Award for Excellence in School Counseling.


