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




Private LTE for School Districts



Overview of Charles County Public Schools (CCPS)





- ▶ 47 total facilities
- 39 schools and centers
- 28,000 + Students
- ▶ 3,700+ staff members
- ▶ 5,500+ badged individuals
- 400 Million Dollar Budget
- ▶ 75% of color
- 36% Free or Reduced meals
- ▶ 11% special education

COVID Timeline

- ▶ March 13th 2020- Schools closed by Gov. order
- ► April 3rd 2020- Virtual learning with packets and recorded lessons
- ▶ June 12th 2020 SY 19/20 ends
- Aug 31st 2020- Schools open virtual. Staff children attend learning centers (300 students)
- November 9th 2020- Initial goal to open in Phase 2 (scratched on 11-5-2020)
- ► March 1st 2021- All teachers report to school
- March 22nd 2021- Phase 2 in-person instruction begins (3,400 students)
- April 19th 2021- Phase 4 in-person instruction begins (additional 5,000 students, AA/BB schedule)

COVID Related Information

- ▶ SSY 21/22 we will be fully open 5 days a week, no virtual option.
- Offer diagnostic COVID testing at each school (rapid and PCR).
- ▶ No talk of mandatory vaccinations for staff or students.
- Partnering with our Health Department to offer vaccinations clinic on our property.
- Monitor COVID in our community daily. Remain nimble as local and state trends appear. Standing by for updated guidance from local, state and federal bodies.


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
