





# School Environmental Safety Incident Reporting (SESIR) System - District & State Reports

The School Environmental Safety Incident Reporting (SESIR) System currently collects data on 26 incidents of crime, violence, and disruptive behaviors that occur on school grounds, on school transportation, and at off-campus, school-sponsored events, during any 24-hour period, 365 days per year. Incidents are reported by schools to the districts which, in turn, provide the data to the DOE.

Districts use standardized **SESIR** codes and definitions to report incidents to the department.


2019-2020 Incidents per 100 Students by Category in Keystone Central SD District


#### 2019-2020 Summary Data by Type of School in Pittsburgh SD District

# Warning Signs

- At least 30 people had knowledge of troubling behavior by the murderer
- •6 instances of Marjory Stoneman Douglas staff being notified
- •19 times a knife, bullet, or firearm was seen in murderer's possession.

#### The Murderer

- 19 year old former student
- Started exhibiting violent behavior at age 3
- In school he had 55 instances of disciplinary action
- Law enforcement at his house 43 times
- Never arrested
- Shot 34 people, 17 fatally in 3 minutes 51 seconds
- Suicidal, homicidal, killed and mutilated animals

#### Prior Law Enforcement Contact

- No prior arrests or juvenile civil citations
- 43 Sheriff Office calls for service involving the murderer or his address
- Some of these calls were made by the murderer himself.
- According to the responding deputies, none of the prior calls constituted a prosecutable criminal offense.
- Two of the prior calls were subsequently investigated internally. It
  was determined that the actions of the deputies involved were not in
  compliance with department policy. Both deputies received substantial
  suspensions.
- Tips reported to the FBI were also found to be handled improperly.

#### January 5, 2018 Tip

- The caller told the FBI that she was even more concerned about his propensity for violence because he had been acquiring guns, including rifles, since his mother's death. Before his mother died, he had "pulled a rifle on his mother." Then, after his mother's death, he took money out of his mother's account and "bought all these rifles and ammunition and he posted pictures of them on the Instagram." The photo was of "a whole bag with all kinds of rifles" and "scopes."
- The caller also explained that his Instagram accounts contained photos of animals he had mutilated and killed. She told the FBI that his interest in killing animals, cutting them up, and posting photos of them was "a red flag."

#### January 5, 2018 Tip Continued

- The caller gave the FBI specific details about his Instagram accounts, spelling out, letter-by-letter, the handles he used on Instagram.
- In addition, the caller said that he had expressed an affinity for ISIS, even dressing up as a member of ISIS and posting messages in Arabic that appeared to threaten that he would do something.
- The caller was specific about the way she expected him to explode—he was going to shoot up a school.
- The caller gave the FBI representative the name and phone number of the individuals who he was living with, and she provided the address of the home where he was living at the time.

#### FBI Lessons Learned

- The Bureau did not forward the information to the local FBI Field Office in Miami, Florida where additional investigative steps would have been taken
- The Bureau did not pass the information along to local law enforcement in Parkland, Florida
- The Bureau did not pass the information along to his likely target— Marjory Stoneman Douglas High School—so that the school could take appropriate measures to prevent the massacre.






## School Hardening Best Practices

- Safer corners
- All classroom doors locked
- All open gates must be staffed
- Opaque covering of classroom door window
- Law enforcement access to school cameras
- Each school must perform vulnerability assessment

#### School Safety Improvements – Florida

- Created Office of Safe Schools within Florida Department of Education
- Created school safety specialist position in each school district
- Fortify Florida Anonymous Threat Reporting System
- Threat assessment teams in every school
- Every school must have an active assailant policy
- Extreme Risk Protection Order / Red Flag Law
- Governor Ron DeSantis empaneled a grand jury to investigate school boards
- Guardian Program 1 armed school safety officer on ALL K-12 campuses
- Alyssa's Alert Law



#### Lessons Learned: Critical Failures

- FERPA
- Law Enforcement had no access to the school cameras
- The School Resource Officer hid behind a concrete pillar for 48 minutes
- Bathrooms were locked
- Classroom doors could only be locked from the outside

#### Cultural Failures

 Culture of leniency in Broward Schools gave the murderer 55 second chances

 Murderer threatened someone, engaged in violence, talked about guns or other weapons 69 times


# Training Builds Confidence

- If you fail to train you are trained to fail.
- Marjory Stoneman Douglas teachers and students did not train.
- Broward Sheriff's Office were not trained in social media threat analysis.
- Broward Sheriff's Office conducted active shooter training every 3 years. 8 deputies heard gunshots and did not enter the building.
- Marjory Stoneman Douglas assistant principal botched the 2016 threat assessment because he had never done one in 30 years.

#### Law Enforcement Response Failures

 Broward Sheriff's Office active shooter policy was MAY go towards the shooter instead of SHALL.

- Broward Sheriff's Office conducted active shooter training every 3 years.
- 8 Broward Sheriff's Office deputies heard gunshots and did not enter the building.
- No Broward Sheriff's Office active bulletproof vest wear policy.



#### **School Safety Measures Implemented in Florida** Post the Marjory Stoneman Douglas High School Massacre

\*Majority of measures were recommended by the Marjory Stoneman Douglas High School Public Safety Commission after their 14-month investigation into the 2/14/18 massacre. Their recommendations were subsequently signed into law by Florida Governor Ron DeSantis.

\*All measures are completed except for ones marked pending.

#### Gun Safety

- Created a legal process (Risk Protection Orders) that requires people meeting certain criteria (threatened) self-harm or harm toward others) to surrender their firearms and prohibits them from purchasing firearms.
- Prohibits gun purchases by anyone under age 21 and requires a 3-day waiting period for all gun purchases.
- Authorizes law enforcement officers to seize firearms when taking someone into custody under the Baker Act for threatened harm toward another person.

#### Complacency Mindset Throughout Parkland

- "It won't happen here" mindset in Parkland
- Principal was disengaged & uninvolved in the threat assessment process. Principal stated "he does not review threat assessment results".
- When asked if he expects to be notified if "someone threatens to shoot up the school" he said no.
- He had no idea of the number of threat. assessments initiated on his campus or the process of the TA.

#### Broward County Public School Threat Assessment Audit

- 23% of the threat assessments had no supporting paperwork.
- Of the 46 samples with supporting paperwork, 65% of the threat assessments included exceptions and were incomplete.
- Not a single high-level threat assessment from any Broward County high school was completed properly.
- Latest audit still showed deficiencies. 60% of medium and high level threat assessments were missing a monitoring plan.

## Ohio School Threat Assessment Training



- Training curriculum developed by Ohio Attorney General Dave Yost as a preventative measure against targeted violence in schools.
- Includes guidance from local, state and national experts in law enforcement and education on incorporating threat assessment in schools.
- Two primary sources of information: U.S. Secret Service National Threat Assessment Center and Dr. Dewey Cornell, University of Virginia.
- Training series includes 10 video segments that range from 8- to 27-minutes in length and a 30page printed reference guide.

# Highlights From U.S. Secret Service Averted Attack Report

 Targeted violence is preventable with the right awareness and protocols.

 This study identifies a series of key findings and commonalities among 67 averted school attack plots targeting K-12 schools that were prevented from being carried out.

 These cases confirm that bystanders coming forward to report concerning behaviors can save lives.

## U.S. Secret Service Averted Attack Report Continued

- School resource officers (SROs) play an important role in school violence prevention.
- Removing a student from school does not eliminate the risk they might pose to themselves or others.
- Students displaying an interest in violent or hate-filled topics should elicit immediate assessment and intervention.
- Many school attack plots were associated with certain dates, particularly in the month of April. 4/20 the Columbine Anniversary.
- Many of the student plotters had access to weapons, including unimpeded access to firearms.

# 2020 Virginia High School Culture & Climate Survey Results

- 106,000 students in 299 schools. The survey was given to students before schools were closed in March.
- Administered to Virginia high schools by the Virginia Center for School and Campus Safety and were analyzed by the Youth Violence Project,
- Most 9<sup>th</sup> through 12<sup>th</sup> grade students and staff agree that school resource officers make them feel safer.

 A sample of 15,707 school staff members revealed 85% somewhat to strongly agreed that SROs make them feel safer at school and 90% somewhat to strongly agreed that SROs make a positive contribution to the school.


