Sandy Hook Public Information Officer Gives Actionable Insight from Tragedy

Now-retired Lieutenant Paul Vance was the chief spokesperson for the Connecticut State Police when the lives of 20 students and six educators were tragically taken at Sandy Hook Elementary in

2012. As commanding officer for the Public Information Office, Lt. Vance became the voice and face of the investigation, preparing and delivering or coordinating all media briefings to the public. He held press conferences with local reporters as well as national and international news organizations. Responding to mass-casualty events takes countless hours of coordination and consideration of various components, including a strategy to interact with the media and to provide support to the local community,

particularly the families directly impacted by the tragedy. In his keynote presentation, Lt. Vance will take attendees through the entire incident to explain the numerous issues that arose and how they were handled. There is no simple solution to many of the problems that were encountered along the way, but through command discussions and investigative necessitates, the state police, with support from a long list of entities, were able to carry out the investigations of 26 murders in just about one year. This presentation is designed to provide ideas and suggestions that could work in other jurisdictions or school systems. Attendees will take lessons learned back home for review and add to or subtract from their own plans for this type of emergency.


